

## MUSICIAN (150 Positions)

Musicians for string, wind, brass and percussion sections are needed, along with a professional conductor. If you have your own band or group, please send a video or DVD demo of selections of music your group plays/sings etc. Those who are not selected will have their recordings returned. Those who are selected will then be assessed for placement within the C.A.I. orchestra as you may be able to fill a position in the orchestra as well. Concert Venues will be arranged by the Events Organiser, and the order of the charity fundraising concert events will be organised by the Musicians' Coordinator. Rehearsals will be held in Bristol on various evenings of the week from 7 to 9 p.m., and weekends for concerts, such as for Friday, Saturday and Sunday afternoons and/or evenings.

We need a first and second violin section (32 musicians), a viola, cello and bass section (38 musicians), a wind, woodwind and timpani section (many more positions), all the type of sections you would find in a professional orchestra, plus a Conductor and Events Organiser to make up a permanent C.A.I. orchestra. We also need bands such as a Rock-n-Roll band, a Jazz band and any other types of musical groups you may belong to such as shown on our C.A.I. Poster. We need Barbershop Quartets, a choir, Country and Western groups, a Reggae group, a Motown and Rhythm & Blues group, Blues Brothers singers, Hillbilly groups and a Salsa group. If you apply as a type of group we need, we may add you to the list of those we may call upon for our monthly concert events when we are ready to start!

Previous experience is necessary. You must be trained to the equivalent of Grade 8 Distinction level with the ABRSM, with orchestral and solo experience. You must be a UK income tax payer and have paid £1k minimum of income tax this year that C.A.I. can use toward your pay. The pay will be £75 per section member with a £25 maximum travel allowance at .40p per mile per concert, £150 per section leader with a £50 travel allowance. A Soloist and Conductor's pay is negotiable with a £75 travel allowance. Concerts will raise funds for charities while also supporting the C.A.I. Project.

The Founder is a professional musician who can assist as needed. He has served as a musician with the San Francisco and Dallas Symphony Orchestras, the Lead Principle Violist with the Sacramento Symphony Orchestra and with the Kansas City Philharmonic. He will serve in lead positions as the Founder of C.A.I. But we need additional musicians who are professional. You must be more interested in the growth and development of the C.A.I. Project than in what you are paid. Eventually charity fundraising concerts will be on a weekly basis. So apply now and get yourself added to the list!
